**Academic Search Premier** Multi-disciplinary, full text for nearly 4,500 journals, including full text for more than 3,600 peer-reviewed titles.

**Anthro Source** Includes current issues of the several Anthropological Association's most critical peer-reviewed publications

**Greenwood Digital Collection** A collection emphasizing history and literature Daily Life through History, and Historic Events of the 20th Century

**Info Trac One file** Index to general periodicals and scholarly journals. Millions of full-text articles.

**JSTOR** Full-text and images of over 150 scholarly journals in a variety of disciplines.

**Master File** Multidisciplinary database provides full text for more than 2,050 general reference publications

**Social Sciences Full-Text** Covers the latest concepts, trends, opinions, theories, and methods of the social sciences

**SocINDEX with Full Text** Sociology research database of over 240 full-text journals from 1895 to present.
