### Library Catalog:

Look in the online catalog for books, journal/magazine titles, videos and other types of audiovisual items held in the library.

- Use a keyword search for anything about photography or a photographer.
- You can also do an author search for a photographer, search last name first.
- Browse in the TRs in Reference and in the Stacks (3<sup>rd</sup> floor) also check other collections such as; Black Studies, Archives, and the Learning Resource Center.

### WorldCat:

Identifies books and journals that are published internationally, and informs you as to what libraries own the item(s).

## Selected Internet Resources:

While the Internet contains a great deal of unique and interesting resources, copyrighted periodical articles and books are not freely available on the web. Commercial indexes such as *Academic Search Elite* are also not typically free on the web. It is to your advantage to use the electronic databases supported by the University and the free Internet Resources on the Internet.

- **Masters of Photography** includes a list of famous photographers, photographs and articles. If you are not familiar with the photographer a biographical summary is included.

To listen to the photographer's voice-over narration, you'll need Shockwave in your browser. The collection includes classic, historic shots from Iwo Jima, the [Korean War](#), the [Bay of Pigs crisis](#), the fall of the Iron Curtain, as well as contemporary crime scenes, [birth scenes](#), and moments of [joy and reunion](#), misery, and death.

- **George Grantham Bain Collection: Library of Congress Prints and Photographs Online Catalog** consists of news photographs from one of America's earliest news picture agencies. Photos document early twentieth century sports events, theater, celebrities, crime, strikes, disasters, political activities including the woman suffrage campaign, conventions and public celebrations. The scope of the collection is worldwide, but there is a special emphasis on life in New York City. Select [New Search] to search or browse an online catalog of the collection.
